It's illegal for anyone under 21 to buy alcohol. But did you know it's illegal for persons under 21....

- to have alcohol in their possession at any time regardless of whether they've consumed any of it.
- to possess or transport an unopened alcohol container in a motor vehicle—regardless if it is in the driver or passenger area (both the driver and the passenger can be charged regardless of age or whether they consumed the alcohol).
- to allow any person to use your motor vehicle after they have been drinking.

It is illegal to purchase alcohol for or provide it to anyone under 21.

It is illegal for anyone under 21 to use a fake I.D. to obtain alcohol.

It is illegal to provide a fake I.D. to anyone under 21.

If you are under 21, you can be cited if you are just holding an alcoholic beverage.

IF YOU GET CAUGHT DRIVING WITH ANY ALCOHOL IN YOUR BODY "Zero Tolerance"

The First Time

- 30-day suspension of your driver's license
- \$125 license reinstatement fee
- 4 points on your driving record
- Fines up to \$250
- Community service
- \$500 Driver Responsibility Payment for 2 years

The Second Time

- 90-day suspension of your driver's license
- \$125 license reinstatement fee
- Fines up to \$500
- Community service
- Substantial insurance rate increase or cancellation
- \$500 Driver Responsibility Payment for 2 years

Did you know **adults** can be held responsible for your drinking behavior?

It is illegal to provide alcohol to minors.

It is illegal to allow minors to use alcohol in your house.

They are legally responsible for anything that might happen to a minor who has been served alcohol in a home.

They may be subject to criminal prosecution and fines.

If they furnish alcohol to a minor they may be liable for monetary damages caused by that individual in a civil lawsuit.

Under 21 IF YOU GET CAUGHT WITH ALCOHOL

WITH A BLOOD ALCOHOL TOLERANCE

If you are caught driving with a blood alcohol content of .08 or above, you will be charged with the adult crime of Operating While Intoxicated.

IF YOU GET CAUGHT WITH ALCOHOL IN YOUR POSSESSION

“MINOR IN POSSESSION”

The First Time

- Fines up to \$100
- Substance abuse screening/assessment at your expense
- If you are under 18, your parents will be notified
- Community service

The Second Time

- Fines up to \$200
- Substance abuse screening/assessment at your expense
- If you are under 18, your parents will be notified
- Community service

- 90-day suspension of your driver's license
- 30 days in jail upon violation of your probation or failure to pay fines

The Third Time

- Fines up to \$500
- Substance abuse screening/assessment at your expense
- If you are under 18, your parents will be notified
- Community service
- One-year suspension of your driver's license
- 60 days in jail upon violation of your probation or failure to pay fines
