PARKS AND RECREATION

This proposal will permit the County to levy up to ¼ of one mill (\$0.25 per \$1,000.00 of taxable valuation) to provide funds for the operation and maintenance of all programs, parks and facilities under the jurisdiction of the Otsego County Parks and Recreation Commission, including the Community Center.

Shall the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution on the amount of ad valorem taxes which may be levied by the County of Otsego, State of Michigan, against taxable property in the County be increased by up to one-quarter (1/4) of one mill (\$.25 per \$1,000 of taxable value) on the taxable value of such property for a period of five (5) years, 2017 through 2021, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for the continued operation and maintenance of all programs, parks and facilities under the jurisdiction of the Otsego County Parks and Recreation Commission, including the Community Center, and shall the Otsego County Board of Commissioners be authorized to levy such millage for these purposes? If approved and levied in its entirety, this millage would raise an estimated \$284,768 for Otsego County in 2017.

This proposal renews up to 1 mill for the purpose of providing funds to the Elmira-Warner Fire Authority to purchase equipment, operate, and maintain fire and rescue services within the Authority's district. The electors previously approved 1 mill, which has now expired.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be imposed on taxable property within the territorial limits of the Elmira-Warner Fire Authority (Elmira Township, Otsego County, Michigan and Warner Township, Antrim County, Michigan) be increased by up to one dollar (\$1.00) per thousand dollars (\$1,000) (1 mill) of the taxable value on all taxable property within the territorial limits of the Elmira-Warner Fire Authority for four (4) years, 2016 through 2019 inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for purchasing equipment, operations and maintenance of fire and rescue services, and shall the Elmira-Warner Fire Authority levy such millage for these purposes? If approved and levied in its entirety, it is estimated that the 1 mill would raise an estimated \$109,364 for the Elmira-Warner Fire Authority when first levied in 2016.
