The Regular meeting of the Otsego County Board of Commissioners was held in the Multi-Purpose Room of the J. Richard Yuill Alpine Center. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Glasser. Invocation by Commissioner Bates, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Administrator Burt.

**INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT AMONGST THE CITY  
OF GAYLORD, OTSEGO COUNTY, AND OTSEGO COUNTY  
BROWNFIELD REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY**

**THIS AGREEMENT** is made the \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2008, amongst the City of Gaylord, 305 East Main Street, Gaylord, Michigan 49735 (hereinafter referred to as "City"), Otsego County, 225 West Main Street, Gaylord, Michigan 49735 (hereinafter referred to as "County"), and Otsego County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority, 1062 Cross Street, Gaylord, Michigan 49735 (hereinafter referred to as "OCBRA") pursuant to the Urban Cooperation Act of 1967, being Act 7 of the Public Acts of 1967, as amended.

**RECITALS**

The parties to this agreement are entering into same In consideration of the following:

1. The Michigan Brownfield Redevelopment Financing Act, Act 381, P.A. 1996 as amended, authorizes municipalities to create a Brownfield redevelopment authority to promote the revitalization, redevelopment, and reuse of contaminated property through tax increment financing of eligible environmental activities.
2. County through its Board of Commissioners established the OCBRA in February, 2005 and appointed its members in July, 2005.
3. The OCBRA has reviewed a Brownfield Plan for the redevelopment of a former landfill located in the southeast corner of the Gaylord Industrial Park and finds that it meets the requirements of Act 381 and constitutes a public purpose of job creation, increased private investment and economic development and increased property tax value.
4. The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality provides grants and loans to communities through its Brownfield Redevelopment Grant And Loan Program to encourage reuse of Brownfield properties by funding demolition and environmental response activities.
5. The redevelopment of the former landfill is a partnership between the State of Michigan, the OCBRA, County, City and Elmer's Crane and Dozer and environmental activities are required as part of the redevelopment.
6. The project effectively meets the program criteria of need for financial assistance, local financial commitment, site reuse, and economic development and job creation.
7. The proposed development is consistent with local development plans, zoning ordinances, and the City of Gaylord Master Plan and will be under land use review.

8. The site for which grant and loan funds are being requested is designated as a "Facility" under Part 201, 1994 Act 451 and neither the applicant (OCBRA) nor the developer (Elmer's Crane and Dozer) are liable parties.

9. The application requests a Brownfield Loan to finance environmental response activities. The developer, Elmer's Crane and Dozer, has or will be entering into a Development Agreement with one or more of the parties hereto, whereby the developer agrees to develop the property and pay any shortfall of tax revenues necessary to meet payments on the loan. The proposed project will be undertaken if a grant and loan are awarded and the said Development Agreement is entered into by the developer.

10. The application for an MDEQ Brownfield Loan to finance environmental response activities necessary for the Elmer's Gaylord Redevelopment Project will be submitted by OCBRA, with Brownfield tax increment revenues derived from the increased taxable value of the property used to pay off the Loan under a Brownfield Plan for the Project.

11. The MDEQ requires a resolution from the County to commit to repay the loan based on the terms and conditions of the loan agreement and to secure the Brownfield Loan with its full faith and credit.

12. The City's participation to secure the Brownfield Loan with a commitment of its full faith and credit is critical to the acceptance and implementation of the Brownfield Loan by OCBRA.

13. County will commit to repay the loan, based on the terms and conditions of the loan agreement and secure the loan with full faith and credit provided that the City and County enter into an Interlocal Agreement under Michigan's Urban Cooperation Act (Act 7, P.A. 1967) effectuating the City's commitment of its full faith and credit to the County to back the County's loan commitment to the MDEQ.

## **AGREEMENT**

In consideration of the above facts and the mutual promises of the parties, the undersigned agree to the following:

1. **Purpose.** It is determined that it is necessary for the best interests of the public to halt property value deterioration, increase property tax valuation, eliminate deterioration and promote increased business activity to undertake the redevelopment of the former landfill property.

2. **Duration.** This agreement is for a period of fifteen (15) years or until the MDEQ loan is repaid.

3. **Implementation.** The implementation of work outlined in the Brownfield Plan (Attachment A) for the former landfill site will be managed by the OCBRA. Financial management will be provided by County.

4. **Financial Support.** The OCBRA will apply for and accept a MDEQ Brownfield Loan (Attachment B). County will provide a resolution to the MDEQ pledging its full faith and credit to

the repayment of said loan (Attachment C), and City will back that support by pledging through a resolution its full faith and credit to County (Attachment D). The loan will be repaid through the capture of Tax Increment Finance revenues from the redevelopment landfill site provided for in the Brownfield Plan approved by the OCBRA and County with concurrence by the City (Attachment E).

5. **Purchases And Contracts.** The OCBRA shall be responsible for managing the project including the hiring and oversight of consultants and contractors.

6. **Promulgation Of Necessary Rules And Regulations And Their Enforcement.** The City and County will be responsible for the promulgation and enforcement of any and all necessary rules and regulations as they relate to activities within their respective jurisdictions.

7. **Liability.** All of the privileges and Immunities from liability, and exemptions from laws, ordinances and rules, and all pensions, relief, disability, workmen's compensation and other benefits which apply to the activity of officers, agents, or employees of any public agency when performing their respective functions within the territorial limits for their respective agencies shall apply to the same degree and extent to the performance of such functions and duties of such officers, agents or employees extraterritorially under the provisions of any such Interlocal Agreement.

This Agreement does not relieve either City or County of any obligation or responsibility imposed upon it by law except to the extent of actual and timely performance thereof by one or more of the parties to the agreement or any legal or administrative entity created by the agreement in which case the performance may be offered in satisfaction of the obligation.

The County shall defend the OCBRA, its agents and employees from any and all claims and losses incurred by or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be damaged or injured during the performance of this Interlocal Agreement except that, the County shall have no duty to defend the OCBRA, its agents and employees from any claims and losses caused by or resulting from the intentional or negligent acts of the OCBRA, its agents and employees. Notice shall be promptly submitted to County of any action being brought against the OCBRA or the other signatories to this Agreement.

County shall indemnify the OCBRA, its officers, agents and employees for any judgment arising from such claims and losses that are not caused by or result from the intentional or negligent acts of OCBRA, its officers, agents and employees, and incurred by or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged during the performance of this agreement. Such indemnity shall include, but not be limited to, attorney's fees and administration costs.

8. **Dispute Resolution.** Any disputes or disagreements arising under this agreement or during the administration of the subject matter hereof shall be resolved through mediation if possible. The parties to such dispute shall either agree to a mediator or, if unable to agree, shall request the chief judge of the Otsego County Circuit Court to appoint a mediator. If mediation fails to resolve the dispute within a reasonable time, the parties shall submit the matter to binding arbitration. If the parties are unable to agree upon an arbitrator, either party may then apply to the chief judge of the Otsego County Circuit Court to appoint an arbitrator. Any decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding.

9. **Accounting Of Funds.** All funds received by the OCBRA for purposes of implementing the Brownfield Plan will be accounted for by County and covered by the annual County audit. Any funds that are received to implement projects that are part of the Brownfield Plan will be accounted for by the County according to the rules and regulations that apply to the funds.

10. **Investment Of Funds.** All funds received by the OCBRA for purposes of implementing the plan and not currently obligated will be deposited by the County in an account earning the best available rate of return allowed by law except as prohibited by federal or state rules.

11. **Nondiscrimination.** The parties agree that all of the activities contemplated by this Agreement shall be conducted in a manner that does not discriminate against any person on the basis of age, race, creed, handicap, color, gender, sexual orientation or national origin.
