Health Department Services

Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program

WIC provides free food to women who are pregnant and breastfeeding, and infants and children up to age 5. The food package is valued at over \$60.00 or more per month, and includes milk, eggs, cheese, cereal, fresh fruit and vegetables, juice, peanut butter, and infant formula. Medical, nutritional, and financial needs are reviewed to determine WIC eligibility. Immunizations, fluoride varnish, blood leads, and caries risk assessments are provided at WIC appointments. WIC also provides education and support for breastfeeding mothers.



Medicaid Healthy Kids and MICHild, and Healthy Michigan Plan

Healthy Kids provides free health insurance coverage for pregnant women and children ages 0-19. The income allowance for Healthy Kids is higher for pregnant women and infants up to their 1st birthday. MICHild is health insurance coverage for uninsured children ages 0-19.

Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS)

CSHCS is a program within the Michigan Department of Community Health. This program is for children and some adults with special health care needs and their families. CSHCS helps persons with chronic health problems by providing coverage and referral for specialty services based on the person's health problems. CSHCS local staff provides family centered services and coordinated community services to assist families in caring for children at home.

Maternal Infant Health Program (MIHP)

These programs assist families with pregnant women or young children by providing information on pregnancy, preparation for the baby, infant care, infant feeding, and parenting. Childbirth education classes and help with transportation costs are also available. Services are available to families with Medicaid and may be provided at the health department or in a family's home.

Newborn Home Visits

Local hospitals and the Health Department are pleased to offer a home visit to every family with a new baby. Families can request the visit during their hospital stay, and a nurse will make a visit to weigh the baby, answer questions, provide information on caring for a new baby, and share information about community resources, such as playgroups.
