REGULAR MEETING
November 4th, 2019

The Vanderbilt Village Council held its regular mtg. on Monday, September 9th, 2019 at the Village Hall. The Council was called to order by Pro Tem R. Musall at 7 p.m. and was opened with the Lord's Prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioners Report – Presented Commissioners update on the jail study, roof on county bldg. is in the process of being repaired; budget concerns due to the governor's line item cuts as a result the county revenue will experience a \$300K shortfall; the bus contract neg. will wrap up at the end of the month. Webcam for the village will be funded by a grant through the county.

Presidents Report –Thanks everyone who was involved the Memorial Park clean-up. Additional thanks to T. Crowe and everyone who donate for the memorial park maint. and preservation. The Trailhead ribbon cutting ceremony was a great success. Thank you again to all those involved in the project.

Street Administrators – Discussed the need to begin the process to have a trainee begin shadowing Stanley in the DPW role for a back-up and for future needs. An employment committee update was also requested regarding DPW pay scale.

Clerk – Consumers Electric will be completing light proj. on 27 in the next week. Christmas decorating is planned for Saturday, Dec. 7th at 11am. All volunteers are welcome to attend. Hot Cocoa and munchies will be provided.

Zoning Administrator- Brief update relating to the zoning issues in the Village. Due to the complexity of the issues this matter was referred to the Village attorney for direction. A letter detailing how the village should proceed is forthcoming.

Code Enforcement- There have been several complaints addressed in the past month. Some of these complaints are being revisited as the violators are still not complainant, while others immediately corrected the situation.

Public Comment: Many thanks to Trevor Whitman for the outstand work he did on the Trailhead park Train shaped bike rack. He did an incredible job, it looks wonderful!
